1. What are the objectives of the LMD system?

- Enhance the application of your theoretical knowledge in a practical work environment.
- Provide the Internship Service with detailed information to help them gain a better understanding of the internship environment.

4. What are the parts of the internship report?

4. 1. Title page

(Including: Full name, student ID, study program, name of the internship organization, name of the internship supervisor, and the start and end dates of the internship)

4. 2. Introduction

- Your goals and objectives for the internship, as well as your expectations and intentions for personal and professional growth.
- Your expectations regarding the benefits the internship can offer, including skills development, professional insights, and career opportunities.
- Presentation of the report sections and their structure.

4.3. Part one – presentation of the internship environment

- The organization's contact information, including name, division, department, and address.
- The name of the supervisor in the company, along with their title and role.
- A brief overview of the organization's purpose, its mission, and a summary of its history and evolution.

A brief description of the work environment:

A- The physical environment, including the locations, facilities, equipment, tools, and software utilized.

B- The human environment, including the organizational structure, employee count, company culture, internal relationships, work dynamics, and overall organizational framework.

4.4. Second part – course procedure

- Your role and responsibilities within the organization.
- The supervision and support provided to you during your time in the company.

4.5. Part three – professional skills

- The differences between this experience and your previous internship, if applicable.
- Your assessment of whether you met the results expected by the employer.
- Your technical skills or attitudes as well as the means to improve the situation.
- Key takeaways from your internship and how it has influenced your decision about your professional future.

- Overall satisfaction with the internship experience.
- Have the expectations presented in the introduction been met?
- Employment sectors to explore or new questions raised by the internship experience.
